ARTICLE 1 - SCOPE

1.1 The policy seeks to highlight the responsible authority, requirements and disciplinary measures to be taken against errant NSAs and procedure to be followed.

ARTICLE 2 - POLICY

- 2.1 Corporate governance demands that every private and public organization be run properly in line with mandate and set standards.
- 2.2 National Sport Associations are mandated to comply with the SRC Act Chapter 25:15 of 1991 and Statutory Instrument 342 of 1995 through submission of annual statutory returns which are:
- 2.2.1 Annual activities report for the year just ended;
- 2.2.2 Audited balance sheet and income and expenditure account for the year just ended; and
- 2.2.3 Estimates of income and expenditure for the coming year.
- 2.3 As a matter of policy, NSAs are categorized in line with their submissions/level of compliance as follows:
- 2.3.1 Category A those NSAs that complied fully;
- 2.3.2 Category B those NSAs that complied partially;
- 2.3.3 Category C those NSAs that did not submit any return; and
- 2.3.4 Category D those NSAs that could not be reached.
- 2.4 Those in category A will deserve a letter of commendation and a certificate of good standing.
- 2.5 Those in category B will be given a letter of reminder to submit the outstanding returns and will not be liable to enjoy certain services from SRC until they have complied, as outlined below:
- 2.5.1 Declined requests for clearance of teams to undertake foreign tours;
- 2.5.2 Declined requests to host international events;
- 2.5.3 Be excluded from programmes such as the ZNYGs and ZNPGs;
- 2.5.4 Declined requests for financial and technical support;
- 2.5.5 Declined requests for duty rebates;

- 2.5.6 Officials from such NSAs shall be disqualified from appointment to management of teams scheduled to participate in multi-sport code events like the AUSC Region V Games and the All Africa Games;
- 2.5.7 Be disqualified from ANSA; and
- 2.5.8 Be liable to any other measures as the Board might deem necessary.
- 2.6 Those in category C will not be liable to enjoy the services as outlined in 2.5.1 to 2.5.8 above, and will be sent for disciplinary hearing in line with the procedure in article 3 below.

ARTICLE 3 – PROCEDURE

3.1 General

- 3.1.1 When an NSA fails to comply with the provisions of the SRC Act Chapter 25:15 of 1991 and the Statutory Instrument 342 of 1995, the Board could start formal disciplinary action against the errant NSA.
- 3.1.2 Before taking formal disciplinary action against an NSA (suspension or deregistration) the Board raises the matter formally with the concerned NSA.
- 3.1.3 If, after affording the concerned NSA an opportunity to make representations in the matter, the NSA does not oblige, a disciplinary hearing is convened, and further action is determined.

3.2 **Disciplinary Steps**

- 3.2.1 The Board serves the errant NSA with summons and a charge sheet to appear before a Disciplinary Committee.
- 3.2.2 The summoned NSA should acknowledge and sign for receipt of the summons and charge sheet.
- 3.2.3 The disciplinary hearing is convened by the Disciplinary Committee appointed by the Board.
- 3.2.4 The accused NSA is appraised of the disciplinary decision.

3.3 Disciplinary Decision	
3.3.1 The outcome of the disciplinary hearing is communicated, in w	riting, to
the concerned NSA not later than a month after the convening	of the
disciplinary hearing.
